Hassan, an up and coming star on Comedy Central's Daily Show, helped us celebrate the 35th Anniversary of the Home Sharing program at our Annual Luncheon in May of 2015. You couldn't have asked for a better way to showcase HIP Housing's cornerstone program which has helped over 16,000 people to find an affordable housing alternative.

But, 2015 was important for other reasons too. It marked the expansion of our Home Sharing program into the City of Fremont (our first toe in the water with a program outside San Mateo County) while also being the year we launched a consulting services arm to help other communities start programs of their own. We secured a significant Measure A grant from the County of San Mateo to help us recruit more Home Providers, and expanded our staff. We also ushered in the tax credit partnership with National Equity Fund (NEF) for the extensive rehabilitation of our senior housing complex known as Edgewater Isle that is home to 112 very low-income seniors.

At a time when the housing crisis has never been worse, we are working hard to capitalize on new opportunities and grow our capacity to provide desperately needed affordable housing. With the help of our talented staff, dedicated Board, and great supporters like you, we will continue to do so with vision and inspiration. Full speed ahead!

Self Sufficiency Program

The Self Sufficiency Program provides housing assistance and support services to low-income parents who are in school to increase their earning power and become financially self sufficient within 2-5 years. Participants receive subsidized rent while they complete an education or job training program and find employment in their field.

While in the program, HIP Housing provides coaching and resources to help participants succeed. Coaches meet with clients once a month for support and accountability to help clients set and reach their goals. Clients attend monthly Life Skills workshops on topics like parenting, resumes, and money management. When a participant graduates from

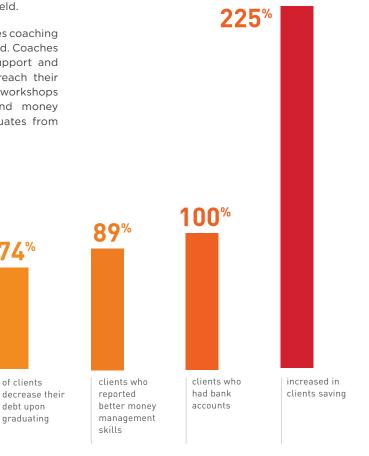

Between 2014 - 2015, 85 families participated in the program.





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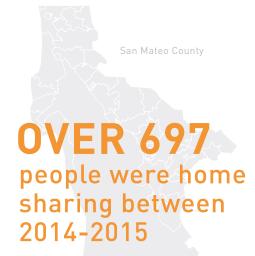

The program prevents homelessness, it provides stable and affordable housing options, and it is the only home sharing program in San Mateo County, and one of the largest in the country.

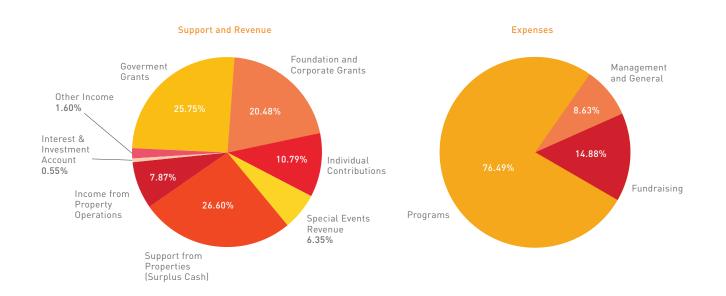

Property **Development**

HIP Housing's Property Development Program provides desperately needed, below market rate (BMR) affordable rental housing in San Mateo County.

Property Development Highlights

HIP Housing owns 14 properties, for a total of 230 affordable housing units that are home to 413 people.

Of those living in properties owned by HIP Housing



- earn > 30% AMI (extremly low income)
- earn > 50% AMI (very low income)
- earn > 60% AMI (low income)

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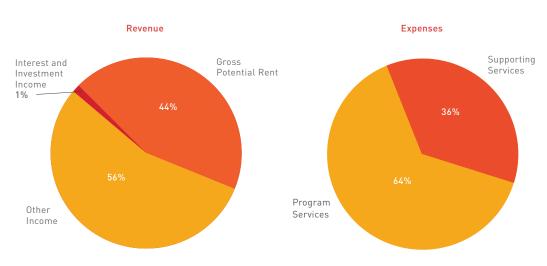

Property Spotlight: Edgewater Isle (EWI)

The Edgewater Isle senior complex in San Mateo, CA is part of the HIP Housing/HHDC housing portfolio. On April 8, 2015, Edgewater Isle was converted into Edgewater Isle Associates, LP in a tax credit partnership with National Equity Fund (NEF).

In this partnership, HIP Housing's affiliate HHDC is the general partner with NEF as the limited partner. As a result of the partnership, \$18M has been invested into the complete rehabilitation of the property which remains home to 112 very low-income seniors.

For the next 15 years, Edgewater Isle Associate, LP will own and operate this property as a deed restricted affordable housing option for very low-income seniors in San Mateo County and will operate it on a calendar fiscal year as opposed a July 1 — June 30 fiscal year like other HIP Housing owned properties.
